Established in 1838, **Milton**, in Rock County, was once a railroad hub in south-central Wisconsin. The gem of Milton is the Milton House Museum, a former Stagecoach Inn certified on the National Network to Freedom and a National Historic Landmark. Milton College enlivened the community from 1844 until 1982. Today, several of the college buildings have found new life as antique shops, offices, apartments, and the city library.

WHERE TO HIKE

Unless otherwise noted, dogs are allowed on the Ice Age Trail and should be under control and leashed at all times.

JANESVILLE TO MILTON SEGMENT

(3.2 miles)

This segment links two suburban areas via a portion of pleasant, tree-lined converted railway path.

MILTON SEGMENT

(4.3 miles)

This segment highlights both the history of the community and the terminal moraine of the Green Bay Lobe where the Milton College Historic District is perched.

STORRS LAKE SEGMENT

(1.8 miles)

This segment passes through woods where Abraham Lincoln camped and features wetlands and mixed forest teeming with songbirds and waterfowl.

The Milton House Museum, the only authenticated Underground Railroad site open to the public in Wisconsin, offers guests the opportunity to learn how a busy 1844 Stagecoach Inn also operated as a station on the Underground Railroad, a loose network of people and places that aided freedom seekers escaping slavery on their journey to freedom. Pause and reflect at the Milton Area Veterans Memorial, noted for its soaring bronze eagle atop an obelisk. Enjoy a glass of wine at Northleaf Winery where nearly all of the 36 wines in the tasting room have won awards in international wine competitions. With food trucks, live music, and special wine release events, there is no better place than Timber Hill Winery to say cheers! Bring your bike and extend your explorations on the Rock River Trail or the Glacial River Trail.


